Flights from major Australian cities service Adelaide. It is a one-hour drive from Adelaide to the entry of the Yorke Peninsula and a 45-minute drive to the Mid North.

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TICKLE BELLY TOUR

FLINDERS RANGES, SOUTH AUSTRALIA

At Tickle Belly guests join Adnyamathanha Elders as they celebrate their culture through storytelling, song and dance connected directly to the Flinders Ranges. Here they will enjoy a three-course gourmet bush food dinner including kangaroo, bush tomato, wattle seed and native lime.

The Yullu Wirru experience takes guests on a journey into Dreamtime legends through stories and song lines about rare insights into the cultural significance of the Flinders Ranges and the reality of survival in this ancient land.

Tickle Belly Hill is located in Pichi Richi Pass, an ancient trade route between the coastal people, the Bungala and Nukanu, and the desert rock people, the Adnyamathanha.
